

Jesus Come Heal Us

Amid the turmoil of the world around us or the deserts of indifference and materialism, Christians accept salvation from God and witness with a different way of life. For us Catholic Christians, Advent refers to two

moments related to the first and second coming of Jesus; the first is the Incarnation and the second is His coming at the end of time. Let our goal for this Advent Season be the strengthening of the faith of all Catholics leading the world to faith by our example. Here are some important ways to do just that:

- **1.** *Participate in Mass*—Regular Mass attendance strengthens one's faith through the Scriptures, the Creed, other prayers, sacred music, the homily, receiving Communion and being part of the faith community.
- **2.** Go to Confession—Like going to Mass, Catholics find strength and grow deeper in their faith through participation in the Sacrament of Penance. It forgives the injuries of the past and provides strength for the future.
- 3. Learn about the Lives of the Saints—The saints are timeless examples of how to live a Christian life, and they provide endless hope. Not only were they sinners who kept trying to grow closer to God, but they also exemplify ways a person can serve God through teaching, missionary work, charity, prayer and simply trying to please God in the ordinary actions and decisions of daily life. I hope you are praying to your saint whom you received at Mass recently.
- **4.** *Read the Bible Daily*—Scripture offers first-hand access to the Word of God and tells the story of human salvation. Reading the Bible is a must for growth in our faith.



5. Read the Documents of Vatican II—The Second Vatican Council (1962-65) ushered in a wonderful renewal for the Church. It impacted how Mass is celebrated, the role of the laity, how the Church understands itself and its relationship with other Christians and non-

Christians. To continue the renewal, Catholics must understand what the Council taught and how it enriches the lives of believers.

- **6.** *Study the Catechism*—The Catechism of the Catholic Church covers the beliefs, moral teaching, prayer and sacraments of the Catholic Church. It's a resource for growing in understanding of the faith.
- 7. *Volunteer in the Parish*—People are welcome as ministers of hospitality, lectors, and other roles in parish life.
- **8.** *Help Those in Need* Helping others brings Catholics face-to-face with Christ and creates an example for the rest of the world.
- 9. Invite a Friend to Mass—Focusing on a renewal of faith and evangelization for the whole Church, a personal invitation can make all the difference to someone who has drifted from the faith or feels alienated from the Church. Everyone knows people like this, so everyone can extend a loving welcome. Be an "Advent disciple" to someone.
- 10. Incorporate the Beatitudes into Daily Life—
 The Beatitudes Matthew 5:3-12 provide a rich blueprint for Christian living. Their wisdom can help
 all to be humble, patient, just, transparent, loving,
 forgiving, and free. It's precisely the example of
 lived faith needed to draw people to the Church in
 the year ahead.

2025 – The Jubilee Year of the Opening of the Holy Door



The Holy Door, also known as the Porta Sancta, is a special door that is typically only opened during Jubilee years in the Catholic Church. A Jubilee is a special year of remission of sins and universal pardon. The first evidence of the rite happening in St. Peter's was in the year 1500

during the papacy of Alexander VI.

Pope Francis has officially dedicated the year 2025 to be a Jubilee Year and to begin this Jubilee Year, Pope Francis will open the Holy Door at St. Peter's Basilica on Christmas Eve, December 24, 2024. The theme is "Pilgrims of Hope" and Hope is the central message of Jubilee Year 2025.

During a Jubilee year, pilgrims from around the world come to Rome to pass through the Holy Door as a symbolic gesture of entering into the mercy and forgiveness of God. The act of passing through the Holy Door is seen as a gesture of leaving the past behind and starting anew in one's faith. The most well-known Holy Door is located at St. Peter's Basilica in Vatican City.

In his *Bull of Indiction*, of May 9, 2024, entitled 'Spes non confundit' ('Hope does not disappoint'), Pope Francis indicated the Holy Door of St. Peter's Basilica and the other three Papal Basilicas, namely St. John Lateran, St. Mary Major, and St. Paul Outside the Walls, will be opened as well as the Holy Father's expressed desire to personally open a Holy Door in a prison 'to offer prisoners a concrete sign of closeness'.

Following the Holy Door opening on Christmas Eve, the Pope, two days later, on December 26, will go to Rebibbia

prison on the outskirts of Rome "a symbol of all the prisons dispersed throughout the world, to deliver a tangible sign of the message of hope for people in prisons around the world". On December 29, Pope Francis will open the Holy Door of the Archbasilica of St. John Lateran, the Cathedral of Rome. On this same day, every Cathedral and co-Cathedral throughout the world will have Mass celebrated by the local Bishop to mark the opening of the Jubilee.

On the Solemnity of Mary the Mother of God, January 1, 2025, Pope Francis will open the Holy Door for the Basilica of St. Mary Major, with the Holy Door for the Basilica of St. Paul Outside the Walls being opened on Sunday, January 5, 2025, the Vigil of Epiphany.

On December 28, 2025, the Jubilee will end in the particular Churches throughout the world, with the Holy Doors of St. John Lateran, St. Mary Major, and St. Paul Outside the Walls being closed on this same date. Finally, the Jubilee Year will formally conclude in Rome on the Solemnity of Epiphany, January 6, 2026.

Asking the Question By Colleen Jurkiewicz Dorman



I have found in my life that if I am certain of the answer to a big and complicated question — right away, no doubts or hesitations — there is a high likelihood that the answer is actually the wrong one.

Because most of the time the truth is buried beneath a thicket of pride, prejudice, and ignorance. To find our answers, we have to be ready to put the gardening gloves on and pick through the thorns. We have to pray. We have to reflect. We have to question ourselves and others. We have to examine our feelings. And then we have to pray some more.

See, I would be willing to bet that the tax collectors and soldiers knew. Deep in their hearts, they knew.

They knew when they approached John the Baptist and asked him, "Teacher, what should we do?" that his reply was *not* going to be: "Keep doing exactly what you're doing."

They had heard this guy preach. They knew what he was about: repentance. They might not have known exactly what John the Baptist was going to tell them to do, but they knew whatever it was, it was going to be a challenge. It was going to turn their lives upside down.

I give them credit for asking the question. That's a hard thing to do, and I don't do it enough. Too often, I'm afraid to ask the question.

How do I love this person? How do I live out my baptismal call in this particular situation — and how do I do it with joy, as we are commanded by the Psalms? *Christmas is ten days away. Are we asking the question?*

Reminder on Qualified Charitable Distributions (QCD) (sometimes referred to as "IRA Charitable Rollovers) as a Way to Donate to St. John's Parish

Under the legislation, donors aged 70½ or older can contribute up to \$100,000 from their IRA's directly to qualified charities without having to pay income taxes on the money.

Here is a quick recap of the IRA Qualified Charitable Distribution rules. Gifts qualify under the law if:

- The donor is age $70 \frac{1}{2}$ or older on the day of the gift.
- The donor transfer up to \$100,000 directly from their IRA to one or more qualified charities. This opportunity applies only to IRA's and no other types of retirement plans.
- The donor does not receive any goods or services in return for the rollover gift in order to qualify for tax-fee treatment.
- The gift/check must be dated on or before Dec., 31, 2024 to qualify this year.
- The gift needs to be sent directly to the charitable organization which also has to be the payee for the gift.
