

Let the Lord Cultivate the Ground of Faith

We need to know that our God is a God of consolation and love. He is always encouraging us. God never gives up on us. He never condemns or rejects us. The Church is for all of us. We are called to be the everyday Christian as we make the effort to renew our relationship with God. Researchers tell us that in our society today, about three out of

every ten people who were baptized Catholic go to Mass weekly. If we count those who go twice or three times a month, the number increases, but the reality is that about half the people baptized into our faith no longer attend Mass. Some still consider themselves Catholic, and some do not. Many have drifted away from the church for so long that they seem lost. Like recently, a person asked me, "Father, I have not been to church for so long; I am Catholic. Would God forgive me?" God never forgets anyone, and welcomes all at any moment into His presence. Maybe for our Regional Retreat, try to invite someone to come and listen to Fr. Bob Kennedy. Invite a friend or family member. Show them some kindness. A loving person tries to always be kind. A true Christian is open and honest and does not judge

There is no doubt that one of the challenges facing the Church is that in our world today, people do not believe much in anything. There is too much self-sufficiency; too much "I am not interested;" and those in power have structured society in such a way as to make it very difficult to live humanely; let alone in a Christian way. So let us not be afraid to be ourselves with God.

Today's society faces a crisis of faith that can only be solved by responding to the personal call to conversion. Let us have time for the Sacrament of Reconciliation to experience the compassion of our God, and let it move us to share this compassion with everyone we meet.

Victory belongs to God's anointed. In the end, we become a sign of the way things will be in heaven, "when every tear will be wiped away," and everyone will be treated with respect and as equals. Even now, Jesus is waiting to talk with us about everything and anything. Why wait? Let us


seek Him, hear His word and fall in love with Him again.

REFLECT

The month of February has traditionally been dedicated to the Holy Family who provide for us a model of marriage and family life. Mary and Joseph perfectly witness to the gift of new life, welcoming the infant Jesus amidst difficult and challenging circumstances. God designed the love of husband and wife to be so complete, so ordered to a lifetime of communion with Himself and each other, that it is open to creating a new human being whom they will love and care for together. Part of God's gift to husband and wife is cooperation with His creative power. In participating in this "great mystery" of love that is total, faithful, and fruitful, married couples become a sign of the love between Christ and his Church Eph 5:32. Couples who cannot bear children still share in this cooperation. As St. John Paul II affirmed to such couples, "you are no less loved by God; your love for each other is complete and fruitful when it is open to others."

While a couple does not need to seek to have a child in every act of intercourse, they should never act to reject the life-giving power granted by God through the use of contraception. In deliberately acting to suppress their fertility, couples harm their unity. For serious reasons, couples may choose to avoid pregnancy for a time or indefinitely. Natural Family

Planning (NFP) can help married couples identify and utilize the naturally infertile times in a woman's cycle, all while cooperating with God's design.

In today's culture, living out God's plan for married love and opening our hearts to the gift of children can be difficult. It can often require great generosity and trust in the Lord. But as Christ repeatedly exhorted, "Be not afraid!" The Church's teaching on married love is an invitation to let God transform our hearts, knowing God's plan is far richer than anything the world can offer us.

Church Conversations: I have submitted a request to Father Peter for a Bulletin announcement concerning the social conversations that are happening prior to Mass beginning, that are distracting to those parishioners that are praying. Coffee Hours: The Collection counters hosted our January Coffee Hour. And we have the Prayer Shawl ministry (Lead by Sue Kilpatrick) volunteering to host the February coffee hour.

FATHER PETER'S UPDATE:

We need to work together with the diocese and make sure we are in compliance with their rules.

The Finance Council is looking into planned giving and ways to ask for our parishioners to consider increasing their giving as we continue to lose parishioners when they pass on.

Social Committee: The goal is to bring people in and keep them active in the parish. Easter Egg hunt will be on Saturday April 10th at 10 AM. Other activities are also being explored and planned out in advance.

TASK FORCE: Nick Verdino: One last meeting on February 25th, the documentation has been finalized to send to the Bishop's office. The bishop had also given a letter thanking the committee for their time and recommendations and for taking the initiative to form this committee. The Bishop also provided some examples of other parish groups that have merged and what has been successful for them. The letter that was written by the task force committee will be posted on the ROC Diocese website after all meetings have been concluded so that others can see the time and thought that went into this research and recommendation.
