

## God Can Do Wonders in Our Lives

Faith is a simple word, yet it contains a powerhouse of potential for our happiness and even our survival as people. Faith cannot be scientifically measured or quantified; yet we know it exists. Countless people throughout time have witnessed

to the importance of faith in their lives. Some have taken their faith to the limits of martyrdom because they remained steadfast for what they believed. For most of us, our faith sustains us in the daily routine of life. As well as for others, faith is the driving force that carries us through our most difficult times.

St Paul once wrote: "If you confess with your mouth that Jesus is Lord and believe in your heart that God raised him from the dead, you will be saved." Romans 10:9. The creed we recite every Sunday at Mass is our statement of faith. So, we can trust that salvation is ours as we "confess" this creed and as we place our faith and trust in the truths that this creed announces.

St Augustine said God created us without our help, but he will not save us without our help. While Jesus' death and resurrection have brought about our redemption we still have a role to play in letting that redemption penetrate our hearts and minds.



Jesus tells us that we cannot serve two masters. If we try to serve two masters, we will either be devoted to one and despise the other, or we will love one and hate the other. Matthew 6:24. Placing this teaching within the context of our lives, most of us probably have several masters we are trying to serve. These include

trying to serve the Lord while trying to gain the love and approval of others. The way to help ensure that our lives and hearts are truly focused on serving the Master, The Lord our God who promotes our greatest good, is through prayer and reflection. 




### Join Us NEXT Sunday, February 9

#### **Candlemas: Origins and Traditions**

Candlemas is celebrated every year on February 2nd and gives the opportunity to taste fabulous pancakes with all kinds of ingredients. It is a festival that gourmands would not miss under any pretext, but do you know its origin?

The word Chandelion comes from the Latin Festa Candelarum or festival of candles.

In the fifth century, Pope Gelasius I associated this pagan rite of the 'Feast of Candles' with the presentation of Jesus in the temple and the purification of the Virgin. It is also said that this same Pope had Crepes distributed to pilgrims arriving in Rome.

In churches, torches are replaced with blessed candles whose glow keeps away the Evil One and reminds us that Christ is the light of the world, just as the Jewish festival of Hanukkah, which lasts eight days is the 'Festival of Lights'.

But it was not until 1372 that the feast of Candlemas was officially associated with the purification of the Virgin.

The traditions of Candlemas and the shape of the Pancakes would also be symbolic representations of the solar disk evoking the coming return of spring.

Did you know that pancakes or Crêpes are found in all civilizations of the Old and New Worlds, whether made from Farina of wheat, rice, corn or other grains.

Several proverbs are associated with this holiday celebrated on February 2 and are supposed to mark a turning point in winter:

At Candlemas, winter dies or gains strength.

At Candlemas the day grows by two hours.

At Candlemas, the Cold makes pain.

#### **Disposing of Your Old Palms**

For those who have old palms at home, we offer you the opportunity to bring them to church for proper disposal. Because the palms have been blessed by a priest and, therefore, are holy objects, the palm branches used for Catholic Church services, especially those used on Palm Sunday, should not be disposed of in the regular fashion. Once an object is blessed, it is considered to be in the service of God and should be treated with respect. It is, therefore, considered sacrilegious to throw a holy item in the garbage where it would end up in a landfill. We will collect the palms and burn them to be used for ashes on Ash Wednesday. Please deposit your palms (no bags please) on or before Wednesday, February 26 in the labeled containers in the narthex. We kindly ask that you do not leave any palms after February 26.

### **The Thoughts of Many Hearts**

It is the very depths of my heart. The place where I am my most authentic self, for better or worse. The place where all my pretensions crumble away, and I am alone with the truth of who I am and what I choose to do.
