

Moment of Mercy

After the opening greeting at Mass, we have a Penitential Rite so that we as a people would recognize God's mercy in the face or our sinfulness. Our prayers show God and ourselves that we are in the process of converting and that we are in need of reconciliation with God and others.

When the priest who is leading the Mass says, "Let us call to mind our sins and ask for God's mercy," it is time

for us to personally ask God to forgive anything we have done wrong or something we failed to do. We then speak words together which either show that we as a people have sinned (I confess to Almighty God and to you my brothers




and sisters...etc.) or words that proclaim God's mercy (Lord have mercy.) Like the sign of peace, this moment of mercy makes us think of Jesus' words, "If you bring your gifts to the altar and you recall that you are angry at your brother or sister, first go and make peace with him or her, then come and offer your gifts." This moment of mercy at the start of Mass is a strong interior moment that leads to peace with God and peace with one another. So please,

Seventh Sunday in Ordinary Time

Over the Jubilee Year we will explore the themes of Hope, Pilgrimage, and Jubilee, always ending with a question for you to consider over the week—similar

to how Deacon Elmer ends his homilies—"What do I think we need to take home with us this week?"



Jubilee Year 2025

Jubilee of Deacons Celebrating Deacons Elmer and Lon!

In the Catholic Church, the diaconate is one of three degrees in ordained ministry bishops, priests, and deacons. Since the

Second Vatican Council, the Latin-rite Church has restored the diaconate "as a proper and permanent rank of the hierarchy". Deacons preparing for the priesthood are transitional deacons, while those not planning to be ordained priests are permanent deacons. Permanent diaconate can be conferred on a single or married man. If he is married, he must be so before receiving the diaconate.

Deacons embrace the Ministry of Word, Ministry of Liturgy, and works of charity which, in their turn, are carried into daily life. Depending on the circumstances, one or another of these may receive particular emphasis in an individual deacon's work but these three ministries are inseparably joined together as one in the service of God's redemptive plan.

Spiritual Reflection

The deacon is obligated to give priority to the spiritual life and to live his *diakonia* with generosity. His model *par excellence* is Jesus Christ, the Servant who lived totally at the service of his Father for the good of every person. It is necessary that each deacon must know Christ intimately to live out his ministry to the fullest, whether he is celibate or married.

In his 2021 address to deacons, Pope Francis expressed a greater focus on cultivating humility and generosity in ministry. Speaking to them, the Holy Father says he expects humble deacons, letting all good be a secret between him and God; he expects deacons to be good spouses, fathers, and grandfathers, inspiring others with their witness of joy in everything without complaining; he expects deacons to be sentinels, to both know the face of the poor and also help the Christian faithful recognize Jesus in them.

The deacon exercises his ministry within the communion and mission of the diocesan Church and in direct relationship with his diocesan bishop, under whose authority he is assigned, as a collaborator in the service of God's people. As collaborators in ministry, serving alongside priests, deacons participate in the apostolic ministry bestowed by Christ upon the Apostles and their successors. "The diaconate is not an abridged or substitute form of the priesthood; it is full order in its own right."

In this Jubilee Year, do everything with humility, with joy without complaining, and in radical hospitality to the poor and marginalized. Allow the love of Jesus to flow from you, as you humbly serve others as missionary disciples. Listen with tender care and affection to the needs of others, especially the poor in your community. In this way, you will be messengers of hope to the world.

Mass & Distribution of Ashes at 7:00 AM, 9:00 AM, 12:05 PM, and 6:00 PM

The act of putting on ashes symbolizes fragility and mortality, and the need to be redeemed by the mercy of God. Far from being a merely external act, the Church has retained the use of ashes to symbolize that attitude of internal penance to which all the baptized are called during Lent.

Ashes will be imposed in the traditional manner, making the Sign of the Cross with the thumb on the foreheads of the faithful, while praying each time: "Remember that you are dust, and to dust you shall return", or "Repent, and believe in the Gospel.'

Our Lenten Sacrifice

Days of Abstinence: On Ash Wednesday, all Fridays* in Lent, and Good Friday—No meat can be taken by all who have reached their 14th birthday.

Days of Fast: On Ash Wednesday and Good Friday—A limit of one full meatless meal for all who have reached their 18th birthday and have not as yet reached their 60th birthday. Sufficient food is allowed at other meal times to sustain strength. No eating between meals. These regulations ought to be observed by all Catholics unless there is a truly important reason, such as health, that prevents their observance. While no dispensation is needed in these cases, a substitute Act of Penance (fasting, prayer, or act of charity) should be done.

Weekdays of Lent: No obligation to fast, however, voluntary acts of self-denial are recommended

Easter Duty Obligation: Must be made from the First Sunday in Lent (February 18) through Trinity Sunday (May 26)

Self-Denial: This is encouraged on a voluntary basis. Acts may include daily Mass, spiritual study, Lenten Devotions, the Rosary, Stations of the Cross, and deeds of mercy and kindness.
