# Feast of the Baptism of the Lord

This Sunday, we celebrate the Feast of the Baptism of the Lord. The public life of Jesus began with His Baptism by John in the River Jordan; this officially marks the end

of the celebration of the Christmas season even though the Church allows us to celebrate the Feast of the Presentation of the Lord on February 2. In cooperation with the Holy Spirit who descended over Jesus in the form of a dove, Christ accepted His mission. He came to fulfill all that was right, submitting to the Father's will. Jesus consented to baptism and His death for the remission of our sins, and is the source of the Spirit for all humanity. It is through our baptism that we, as Christians, are sacramentally assimilated to Jesus. We take His mission. John had been proclaiming the words of the prophets to the people and teaching lessons of charity, repentance, truthfulness, honesty, and justice in everyday life. As Christians, each of us can rightly say that God has called us. We have heard at one time or another that we are "children of God." But what does this mean?

By our faith, we are instructed that if we face difficult and challenging times in life, Christ is there with His compassion. By the grace of our baptism, we call upon him to help us in those moments, and many times, by His grace, we are saved. As God's children through baptism, we are blessed with the faith of His loving kindness and mercy to meet life's struggles. We approach the Lord, the Lamb of God, with humility and repentance, knowing that in HIM, ALL WILL BE WELL. As we are in the first month of the year 2025, what a joyful and comforting thought that is. In Christ we pass from worry to peace, from



pain to comfort; however it is up to each individual to ask Jesus for His help and grace in those areas challenging us. There are demands placed upon us when we accept the challenge to be a follower of Christ. There will be joy that comes from

accepting the message of Christ and following it in our lives, there will also be suffering that comes to those who prefer darkness. We do not want darkness to blind our eyes. We want the light of Christ to illuminate our way in the world. Just as prayer was essential in the ministry of Jesus, it must be essential in our own lives, too. This is how we will be able to reach our goal, to one day be called to be with Christ in the heavenly kingdom—a Kingdom where there will be no more suffering, no more darkness, only rejoicing with the Saints and angels.

Let us then, work and pray that we may develop and nurture that personal relationship with Jesus that God asks of us. Such a relationship is what will guide and comfort us through this life and

welcome us to the next.

Bless our efforts to look at all the ways we are united in faith, and grant us courage to change our hearts and minds to realize your will.


We ask all this through Christ our Lord and brother, in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the **Holy Spirit.**

# RESPECT LIFE | Prayer & Action January Prayer Guide

### **PRAY**

Our Father, 3 Hail Marys, Glory Be

The Supreme Court's decision in Dobbs v. Jackson Women's Health Organization overturned Roe v. Wade, ending the nearly fifty-year reign of nationwide abortion on demand. Dobbs returned the issue of abortion to the people's elected representatives at the federal and state levels. Since the Dobbs decision, many states have enacted strong legal protections for preborn children. Tragically, other states have drastically expanded abortion. In the most recent election, ten states featured ballot initiatives that would enshrine abortion in state constitutions, with seven of them voting in favor of abortion and overriding pro-life safeguards in the process.

Abortion is currently legal in more states than not. Continuing work is urgently needed to protect children, women, and families from the tragedy of abortion. At this critical moment, whether we reside in states with pro-life or pro-abortion policies, we are presented with opportunities and responsibilities to continue building a culture that welcomes, celebrates, and protects human life. Our prayer and action are essential to maintaining policies that protect life, where they exist, and preventing the spread of policies that lead to more abortions. As we mark the solemn anniversary of Roe v. Wade this January, recalling the millions of lives that have been lost to abortion, may we recommit ourselves to the cause of life.

In addition to our efforts to protect human life in law, we must redouble our efforts to serve women facing unexpected or difficult pregnancies, offering them the compassionate support they need to lovingly welcome the gift of their children. We must do whatever we can in every sphere to ensure that life is welcomed, and mothers are supported.

- Sign up to join Catholics across the country in praying for the end to all abortion during the <u>9 Days for Life</u> novena from January 16-24.
- Participate in a local, state, or national pro-life event during the month of January to advocate and pray for the protection of preborn life. (Check with your parish and diocese for information about events in your area.)
- Connect with your pastor to display pro-life materials in your parish. Visit our Respect Life Store for printed materials.
- Offer some other sacrifice or prayer that you feel called to do for this month's intention.


