# Something to Ponder this Summer

What can we humans say as we wind down our summer vacation? Did we have fun with family and friends? Are we back to work or getting our children back to school? Anxiety and anticipation seem to be natural parts of our lives.

One thing that causes anxiety is that we do not know how the events around us will affect us or our families. Some believe it would be easier if we knew everything that was going to happen to us. But the truth is, we sometimes have to place our faith in someone or something, and trust that everything will turn out fine. We are growing in a world of myriad experiences, and we have conflicting approaches to our Christian spirituality and beliefs. In the words of Michael Josephson,

"The paradox of our time in history is that we have taller buildings, but shorted tempers; wider freeways, but narrower viewpoints; we spend more, but have less; we buy more, but enjoy less. We have bigger houses and smaller families; more conveniences, but less time; we have more degrees, but less sense; more knowledge, but less judgement; more experts, but more problems; more medicine, but less wellness. We drink too much, smoke too much, spend too recklessly, laugh too little, drive too fast; we get too angry



too quickly, stay up too late, get up too tired, read too little, watch TV too much and pray too seldom. We have multiplied our possessions, but reduced our values. We talk too much, love too seldom and hate too often. We've learned to make a living, but not a life; we've added years to life, not life to

years. We've been to the moon and back, but we have trouble crossing the street to met the new neighbor. We've conquered outer space, but not inner space; we've done larger things but not better things.

We've learned to rush, but not to wait; we have higher incomes, but lower morals; we have more food, but less appeasement; we build more computers to hold more information to produce more copies than ever, but have less communication; we've become long on quantity, but short on quality. These things make us ponder about something which is called life."

What does it mean to you and the other person beside you in terms of peace, harmony and love? Trust life, and it will teach you, in joy and in sorrow, all you need to know. Jesus encourages



us to place our cares and worries in his hands, that we may experience more fully the peace he came to give. Blessings and peace to all, Rev. Peter Enyan-Boadu

# Mission Appeal NEXT Weekend, August 3/4

**Rev. Kilian C. Tereba,\*** a priest based in Canton, OH, and bona fidei priest of the Diocese of Kigoma in Tanzania will represent the Diocese of Kigoma during this Mission Appeal.

#### THE DIOCESE OF KIGOMA

The Catholic Diocese of Kigoma is one of 35 dioceses in Tanzania. It is located in the rural western part of Tanzania in East Africa. The diocese has a population of 2.2 million of whom 509,000 are Catholics. Rev. Joseph R Mlola, the ordinary of the diocese has 66 diocesan priests, about 20 religious priests, religious nuns and brothers and 620 catechists who minister in parishes, outstations, and special ministries throughout the diocese.

The Diocese of Kigoma is very poor due to the low income of her people who earn their livelihood through traditional agriculture which is un-mechanized, small-scale, and relying on weather. Bad weather leads to many people not having food to sustain families throughout the year. Poor earning of our people affects their ability to support the various ministries in the diocese.

The Diocese of Kigoma makes this mission appeal this year to support:

**Ministry to Orphans:** This ministry comprises 1000 orphan children in two orphanages. Our orphan children have been left behind after the deaths of their parents due to HIV pandemic and many other tropical deceases. The diocese is trying to provide these children with their educational, spiritual, medical, and nutritional needs.

**Ministry to the Refugees:** This ministry comprises 300,000 refugees in three refugee camps located in the Diocese. The refugees in our diocese are running away from their home countries due to existing civil wars. This population arrive in the camps wounded in so many ways and has lost almost everything with many of their families dead and displaced. The Diocese needs to minister to them. Your generosity to our ministries will make great difference in the lives of these suffering sisters and brothers.

**Ministry to Seminarian Formation:** This ministry comprises of 95 college level seminarians who study in different collage years for our diocese. Covering educational expenses for our seminarians is a challenge. Most of our seminarians come from the very financial humble families who are struggling to make ends meet. The diocese needs to find means to provide these young men with financial aid so that they may remain in formation.

\*Father Tereba's brief bio: After his graduate studies at John Carroll University in Cleveland, OH and then his Clinical Pastoral Education (CPE) program at St. Vincent Charity Medical Center in Cleveland, Fr. Kilian returned to his home diocese where he was a parish priest for two years before his bishop sent him back as a missionary in Canton, Ohio. He is currently a priest chaplain at Mercy Medical Hospital in Canton, Ohio. May the Eucharistic Presence of Jesus strengthen Catholics to stand up for the protection of every human life.

#### REFLECT

This summer we enter our third year of the National Eucharistic Revival and joyfully celebrated Christ's presence among us at the National Eucharistic Congress in Indianapolis. Part of the impetus for the revival was a recent study that revealed many Catholics do not believe, or at least do not understand, that Jesus is truly present in the Eucharist, though in a hidden way.

Similarly, many in our culture do not acknowledge the dignity of human life when it is hidden in the womb. Both of these instances call for us to help others recognize these sacred gifts that are hidden. We need to help them to understand that just because something may not be apparent to our eyes does not mean that it is not there or that it is not important.

The Eucharist and the Gospel of life go hand in hand because they have the same source—Jesus himself, who is the Bread of Life. Christ gave his very flesh to give us the gift of eternal life and invites us to the most profound experience of this gift in our celebration of the Eucharist. The Eucharist has the power to transform the depths of our hearts and the heart of our culture.

Lord Jesus, by the power of your Eucharistic Presence, helps us to defend the life of every human person at every stage. Transform our hearts to protect and cherish all whose lives are most vulnerable. For you are God, with the Father and the Holy Spirit, forever and ever. Amen.
