We need to know that our God is a God of consolation and love. He is always encouraging us. God never gives up on us. He never condemns or rejects us. The Church is for all of us. We are called to be the everyday Christian as we make the effort to

renew our relationship with God during this Lenten time. Researchers tell us that in our society today, about three out of every ten people who were baptized Catholic go to Mass weekly. If we count those who go twice or three times a month, the number increases, but the reality is that about half the people baptized into our faith no longer attend Mass. Some still consider themselves Catholic, and some do not. Many have drifted away from the church for so long that they seem lost. Like recently, a person asked me, "Father, I have not been to church for so long; I am Catholic. Would God forgive me?" God never forgets anyone, and welcomes all at any moment into His presence. The Synod the Church is currently undergoing is in place partly to address what the driving forces are that have led to this continual decline.

There is no doubt that one of the challenges facing the Church is that in our world today, people do not



believe much in anything. There is too much self-sufficiency; too much "I am not interested;" and those in power have structured society in such a way as to make it very difficult to live humanely; let alone in a Christian way. So let us not be afraid to be ourselves with God. Today's society faces a crisis of

faith that can only be solved by responding to the personal call to conversion. Let us have time for the Sacrament of Reconciliation to experience the compassion of our God, and let it move us to share this compassion with everyone we meet. Invite a friend or family member. Show them some kindness. A loving person tries to always be kind. A true Christian is open and honest and does not judge the heart intentions of the other.

Victory belongs to God's anointed. In the end, we become a sign of the way things will be in heaven, "when every tear will be wiped away," and everyone will be treated with respect and as equals. Even now, Jesus is waiting to talk with us about everything and anything. Why wait? Let us seek Him,



hear His word and fall in love with Him again.



Diocesan Day of Penance and Mercy

Wednesday, April 2, 2025

Here at St. John the Evangelist Church, as well as all parishes throughout our diocese, there will be the opportunity for the Sacrament of Reconciliation on Wednesday, April 2, 2025. Times at parishes vary but here at St. John's, Fr. Peter will hear confessions from 10:00 AM 'til noon AND 3:00 PM 'til 5:00 PM.

As a continuation of last weekend's article that included information on Examination of Conscience prior to the Sacrament of Reconciliation, we offer the following on celebrating the Sacrament of Reconciliation:

The forgiveness of sins involves four parts:

- **Contrition**: a sincere sorrow for having offended God, and the most important act of the penitent. There can be no forgiveness of sin if we do not have sorrow and a firm resolve not to repeat our sin.
- **Confession**: confronting our sins in a profound way by speaking about them- aloud- to God through the priest.
- **Penance**: an important part of our healing is the "penance" we perform in reparation for our sins.
- Absolution: the priest, by virtue of his ordination, speaks the words by which "God, the Father of Mercies" reconciles a sinner to Himself through the merits of the Cross

Rite of Reconciliation

The Sacrament may be celebrated face-to-face or anonymously, with a screen between you and the priest.

1. The penitent (you) and the priest begin with the sign of the Cross, saying: *"In the Name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit."*

2. The priest urges the penitent to have confidence in God with these or similar words: "May the Lord be in your heart and help you to confess your sins with the true sorrow."

3. The priest may read or say a passage from Sacred Scripture after which the penitent then states: *"Forgive me, Father, for I have sinned. It has been [tell him however many days, weeks, months or years] since my last confession."*

4. The penitent then states his or her sins. For the confession to be valid, the penitent must confess all of the mortal sins he or she is aware of having committed since the last confession, be sorry for them, and have a firm purpose of amendment to try not to commit the same sins in the future.

5. After this, the priest will general give some advice to the penitent and impose a penance.

6. Then he will ask the penitent to make an act of contrition. The penitent may do so in his or her own words, or may say one of many memorized acts of contrition like the following from the *Rite of Penance:*


Act of Contrition

"O My God, I am sorry for my sins with all my heart. In choosing to do wrong and failing to do good, I have sinned against you, whom I should love above all things. I firmly intend, with your help, to do penance, to sin no more, and to avoid whatever leads me to sin. Our Savior Jesus Christ suffered and died for us. In his name, my God, have mercy." (#45) OR

"Lord God, in your goodness have mercy on me; do not look on my sins, but take away all my guilt. Create in me a clean heart and renew within me an upright spirit." (#92)

7. After this the priest will pray the prayer of absolution, which absolves the penitent from their sins.

8. The penitent makes the sign of the Cross and answers, "*Amen*". **9.** The priest will then dismiss the penitent with a short prayer and encouragement. The penitent should try to fulfill the penance imposed as soon as possible.


