As I grow in these years, I have come across some wonderful priests, bishops, and laity who have taught and helped me serve in the Rochester area. They continue to be an inspiration to me. There are also enormous challenges to overcome as our

faith is becoming so secularized, and people have a different connection with God, unlike what it used to be. For me, as the priest in charge of St. John's parish for nearly 13 years, I see hope and joy amid the many challenges present in the parish. I see a tremendous display of faith in those who make it to Mass every week. I also see some old and new challenges that need to be addressed in time. During this Lenten season of faith renewal, what comes to my questioning mind is, what does believing and belonging mean in our lives as Christians? Doesn't believing and belonging go hand in hand? Are we at the crossroads of faith? How do we invite others to worship with us? Who will build our church? Is it the priest, the nun, the religious, the teacher or the parents? All of us are needed and called forth to build the Church.

There is a story told about Alfred Nobel reading his own obituary because the people at the newspaper mistakenly thought he'd died. This gave him the opportunity to see how he would be



remembered. The article described Mr. Nobel as a brilliant chemist who made a great fortune as the inventor of dynamite. For lots of people, being remembered as brilliant and rich would be quite enough, but it wasn't for Nobel. After significant reflection, he desired to leave a more positive

legacy. He bequeathed his considerable wealth to establish the Nobel Prizes to acknowledge great human achievements. Few of us can create something as momentous as the Nobel Prize, but we can all live lives that would earn a eulogy that our family, parents, and friends would be proud of. In the hustle and bustle of everyday living, it's hard to keep perspective. Money, position, pride, and power, priest, bishop, and pope seem so important —until they're not. What matters is how long we will be remembered, by whom, and for what. Our Christian call is to love one another and do the best we can gracefully to accomplish the mission of Christ here on earth.

Lent and our journey of faith in this time of our Church's history should challenge us all. We need



a new "us" to grow together in Christ. Believing means belonging together in Jesus.

Pastoral Planning Update

The Recommendation from our parishes went to Bishop Matano on January 15. Some excerpts from his response to the task force: "Allow me to begin by

expressing my deep gratitude for the time and effort made in proposing the Recommendations, which reflect a genuine love for pastoral ministry and a sincere desire to continue this ministry into the future with the mind and heart of Jesus Christ." "I have noted your consultations with the faithful and your sensitivity to their input, your emphasis upon fostering vocations to the priesthood, your areas of inter-parochial cooperation...and above all your emphasis upon the Most Holy Eucharist as the heart and center of every parish." The Bishop invited representatives from the Task Force to make a presentation at the March 11 meeting of the Presbyteral Council. The Recommendation and the Bishop's full letter are available on the ROC Catholics Northwest website: ROC Catholics Northwest or https://www.roccatholicsnorthwest.org or from the parish office.

The Task Force had its last meeting on February 25. In its place a Steering Committee will be formed to coordinate the collaboration of our 7-parish committees. Its members will include Fr. Bill Coffas and Fr. Lee Chase as the two Deans within our parishes, Dcn. Frank Pettrone as our local Pastoral Administrator, a member from the Evangeli-

zation Committee, a member from the Vocations Committee, and either the Web Administrator or his backup. The committee will meet 2-3 times a year.

Finance Council Meeting Minutes—January 29, 2025

Attendance: Avg total weekly is about 420 – but is inconsistent: Our aim is 430.

Our collections are down about 2% from last year but this matches other similar parishes.

No real surprises in any of these numbers.

Collections: the Charts from Chris summarized things clearly:

- After 30 weeks into the 2024-25 Fiscal Year, the collections from only 12 weeks met/exceeded weekly budget, and 18 were under budget.
- This was for regular collections (including online contributions) and does not include Holy Days and special collections such as Boiler/Capital Improvement Funds. Keep in mind that these "other" collections stay within the parish and are used to fund daily operations.
- We experienced a bad September in which all 4 weeks were under budget, but we have made steady progress since then
- We had about 40 funerals last year and that leads to lower weekly contributions and attendance.

3—Q2 Financial Statement Review Balance Sheet – distributed at meeting:

We have a strong Balance Sheet and a very good cash position.

- We use our interest-bearing Money Market Acct to replenish our Checking Acct when needed.
- The Diocese wants us to move more of our money into Communis Investments – which have done very well recently.
- We have agreed to consider this as we move through the year.
- Communis Funds are a source of cash if needed.
- Can request 5% of the balance, once per Fiscal year, and it takes about a month to obtain the money.
- Communis Returns: approximately 8.6% over the past 5 years.
- St. John's received \$830k from sale of school and this was to be the Parish's "IRA" to serve our financial needs over time. It was deposited into Communis.
- Philosophy behind Communis Fund is to "out-perform if the market is down, and under-perform if the market is high"

Revenue and Expenses: printed results were distributed at the meeting.

• We expect, based on figures from 2 pg Summary of Revenue & Expenses:

1.a \$20k deficit from Operations

2.a \$115k in Non-operating <u>revenue</u> (Interest and Communis gains)

3.a \$95k overall profit

4.Need to consider an Increased Giving Campaign, and a parish sub-team was formed and a kick-off meeting was held on 2/8/25.

- Main expense items:
 - 1.CBO (Central Business Office) expenses (included in Salaries) decreased 6% due to having more parishes in the CBO across which to allocate funds for Finance Director but added one person to help handle increased number of parishes.
 - 2. Snow removal costs have been very high this winter.
 - 3.Some expenses, e.g., School Subsidy and Insurance, are budgeted Qrtly to match the timing of bills.
 - 4.Courier bill is based on the number of Catholics a Parish is "responsible for" in its geographic area out of our control.
- I offer the following for those who might not be acquainted with the Central Business Office (CBO):
 - 1. The CBO is a team of 4 people responsible for many of the administrative business functions for the parishes who use it. The CBO, which resides on the campus of St. Charles Boromeo, currently serves 9 parishes on the West Side of Monroe County. Included are St. John the Evangelist - Greece, St. Charles Borromeo, Our Mother of Sorrows, Holy Cross, St. Pius X, St. Theodore's, St. Christopher's, Parish of the Holy Family (combination of St Jude's, St Helen's, and Holy Ghost), and Parish of St. Martin de Porres (group of 3 worship sites serving Scottsville, Churchville, and Caledonia).
 - 2. The main duties performed by the CBO for St. John's include using standardized posting of our Collections, and posting of our invoices, and then cutting checks for invoices and Check Requests approved by Fr Peter. The CBO also reconciles our Bank Accounts and administers Diocesan Finance Policies and Procedures primarily those dealing with money handling by Ushers and Money Counting Teams.
 - 3. The CBO is managed by Chris Frontale, the Regional Finance Director for St. John's and the other parishes.

4—CMA Update

- Goal for 2024-2025 was decreased by \$3,000 over previous year.
- Parish met it earlier than last year with 17 fewer donors.
- One key use of the funds is for the operation of the Diocese.
- If we exceed our goal, the Diocese returns 50% to the Parish. Reasoning is that if a parishioner gives a CMA gift to the Diocese, then any money returned as in 50% of the "overage", is really a gift from the Diocese to the Parish.

5—Buildings & Grounds Grounds – Misc items:

- Our Church Roof will come off warranty in 2026 so we have to start thinking about next steps along with the issues with the Silo above altar.
- Will not be using Birchcrest this year to service Ash trees
- We have renewed our contract with Trimline for 2025 Lawn Maintenance

Snow Removal:

• Our contact with Trimline will end at the end of the 24-25 Winter Season. It covers snow removal from Parking Lot and sidewalks and is very expensive.

FINANCE COUNCIL MEETING MINUTES Continued from page 5

- The snowplowing contract calls for a single amount to be spread over 3 payments over the season, but the side-walk shoveling, and application of salt and ice melt are charged on a per-visit basis sometimes more than once in a single day. For example, our most recent bill was for \$17.600 of which \$3800 was our 3rd installment on the contract and \$5,550 was for Salting, \$3,750 for Sidewalk Clearing and \$4,500 for Ice Melt.
- Shoveling and salting the walkways is a big expense.
- Terms and expectations for our next contract will be changed and we will consider other vendors.

HVAC Equipment:

Parish needs to replace one HVAC unit outside the Parish Center. This is the one closest to the Rectory. We got through the winter of 23-24 with it on borrowed time. Considered proposals from 3 vendors:

Crosby/Brownlie - eliminated because proposal was too high, Leo J. Roth, and Monroe Piping

- Roth and Monroe are excellent vendors and each had strong support from Council members during the discussion.
- Council voted to accept the proposal from Monroe Piping mainly due to cost and the ability to handle any needed concrete work in-house and for no additional charges.
- The contract with Monroe was signed on 2/4/25.
 We have not yet seen a timeline for the work.
 One question to be decided: should the vents in the Parish Ctr be cleaned as part of the project. Monroe will assess. If it is needed, some other vendor will do it.
- Council also discussed how to proceed on a new PM (Preventative Maintenance) contact for all HVAC equipment used in Church and Parish Center. Rectory HVAC was not included because it is covered by a PM contract we have with Paris Heating/Cooling.
- Each vendor (Roth and Monroe) visited our site and took a good look at what would be the scope of PM for our older HVAC units (Boilers + Air Handlers + Control Units) and said they could handle the job.
- Based on the discussion:
- 1.We terminated the PM agreement we had with Crosby/ Brownlie
- 2.We signed a one-year PM contract with Monroe Piping mainly to not mix vendors at this time. The Contract was signed on 2/4/25.
- 3. The Contract and vendors can be revisited in the future.

Bankruptcy Update - was not discussed;

Date for next Council meeting was not set.
