

## **Dying You Restored Our Life**

As we are in the month of November, we see the beauty of the month in its wonderful shades of color and events. Let's take notice of what the month presents us spiritually and incorporate it into our prayer life. In the month of November we are called in a special way to remember our brothers and sisters who have fallen asleep in the hope of the resurrection. In these past days of Eucharistic celebrations, we

focused our attention on the communion of the saints. Almost everyone who has taught religion will tell you that sooner or later someone will ask why people suffer or die. To an eight year-old, and I guess even to an eighty year-old, it just doesn't seem fair that people who follow God's law and keep His commandments seem to undergo so many hardships in sickness and difficulties of death. 

CMA UPDATE: Our 2024 campaign has begun.

- Commitment to date: \$8,000 Our CMA goal: \$78,000 • Paid To date: \$7140
  - \$\$ still needed: \$70,860

We need to Average \$240 per donor in order to reach our goal. This is based on last year's donor numbers.

Coffee Hours: Still looking for ministries to host February and March. I know the Parish Council is signed up but if you are a member of another ministry that has not signed up to host a coffee hour, please talk to your ministry members and please, let's fill these openings. Karen and Melissa - Stand up and take a bow. I know you had many helping hands, but you were the brain trust for this idea.

Fall Festival: is being held on 10/13. Donations have been donated from Deconick (including decoration and the pumpkins) and a few local businesses as well. There will be games, and a chili cook off.

Diocesan - Wide CENSUS: Tod, please bring us up to date. St. John's has been assigned to Phase 2 Late Summer/Fall. Bishop Matano has outlined: "The purpose of this census is to gather accurate and up-to-date information about all our registered parishioners, as well as those Catholics not yet registered in our parishes. By conducting this comprehensive survey and obtaining accurate contact information, we aim to strengthen pastoral care and enhance communication by having a reliable means of informing you about events, programs, ministries, and greater opportunities for spiritual growth at your parish and throughout the Diocese." We are listed as St. John the Evangelist of Greece (originally we were listed as St. John the Evangelist of Rochester)

Social Committee: Karen Bessette and Melissa Ryan have volunteered to co-chair this committee. Karen & Melissa please bring us up to date on what is happening with the Fall Festival.

Pies for the Holidays: (lead by Maureen Beattie under the umbrella of Social Ministry-Maureen spoke with Karen and Melissa before this fundraiser was set in motion) item on tonight's Agenda, people have probably

seen the info in the bulletin these past 2 weekends but here is the info: Orders can be placed through the month of October-last day orders can be received at the Parish Office is October 31. Pie orders will be available for pick up in the Parish Center on Monday, November 18 from Noon 'til 2 pm and from 5 pm 'til 7 pm.

Arts and Environment: Poinsettias have been ordered for December delivery. Giving trees will be put up after Thanksgiving and all the angels will be asking for gifts, not monetary donations. Volunteers will be recruited to fill out the angels and to sort them for the receiving donors.

Food Collection Days: Pam Tofany-Kern – The weekend of October 19/20 will be the next food collection. With a drop-off on October 21. They are looking for Chunky soups, sardines, stuffing, boxed pasta, rice and noodles, peanut butter and jelly, supplemental beverages, toiletries, diapers, etc. The boxes will be here the week before the collection dates for any early donations that come in.

Task Force: There will be a date for the task force to meet with the parish council and finance team members from each of the seven parishes on October 15. Informational packets were given to council members to review and have an opportunity to submit questions that should be addressed. There will be an open forum for ALL parishioners on November 20, and there will be an afternoon and evening session.

Certificates of Appreciation: 2 certificates/ nominations pending.

Liturgy Committee: Blessing of the pets went very well. Masses for All Saints and All Souls Day were announced. Thanksgiving Mass will be at 9 am. Please study the proposed bill (Proposal 1) that we are voting on in the next election. There will be a bulletin insert to share some information on this proposal.

**Pastoral Ministry/Homebound Outreach** Update: COVID is on the rise, and this causes some challenges visiting the nursing homes.

Knights of Columbus Council 3892 Update: The annual Columbus Day dinner will be held on October 19 at St. Charles parish center. This year's dinner will benefit the Focus Pregnancy Help Center. The 40 Days for Life campaign is in day 13 and two babies have already been saved.

Social Committee Update: There will be a Dady Brothers concert in our Church on December 7 celebrating Advent sounds. We are only 1 of 4 parishes they are performing at this year. Tickets will be available through the Knights of Columbus.
